St Michael's Parish Tithing Goal

The Parish Tithing amount for November collections was calculated at \$404.00 or 10% of the monthly collection which was \$4024.00 and a check has been sent to the diocese. To date the PCT payments have totaled \$2041.00.00.

Pastoral Reflections

Scripture Reflection (Baptism of Our Lord: Year C) This uplifting oracle exhibits the welcome change in mood reflected in the second half of Isaiah's book. The prophet's earlier oracles reflected a national failure in faith; this oracle gives evidence of God's initiative for salvation.

The baptism of Jesus raises more questions than it answers. Why did he do it? What does it mean? Why has such an event been included in the Gospel? Regardless of why we might think Jesus was baptized by John, this story appears in Gospel because historically it happened—and people knew that. Obviously, it made sense to the Gospel writer, and that is what we have to focus on.

Could John the Baptist be the Messiah? At the time the Gospels were being written, some of John the Baptist's disciples were claiming that John was the real Messiah and not Jesus. All the Gospels refute this claim. The strongest refutation comes from John himself who claims to be unworthy even to loosen the thong of Jesus' sandals. John clearly proclaims that he baptizes with water, but one mightier than he is coming, someone who will surpass John in all ways. This, of course, is a reference to Jesus.

The Holy Spirit and fire. John claims to baptize with water. but Jesus will baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire. This statement's meaning is debated. Most commentators understand it as a metaphor symbolizing the power of Pentecost combined with the purifying power of fire. It does not seem to be an indication that an additional Baptism of Spirit and fire will be required of Jesus' followers.

The voice from heaven. All aspects of this baptism event led to this point. After Jesus had been baptized, his first response is to pray. This detail about prayer should not be overlooked. Major moments in Jesus' life and ministry are accompanied by prayer. Then the heavens were opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice comes from heaven, declaring, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." Here God is confirming Jesus as God's Son. This affirmation substantiated by the gift of the Spirit prepares Jesus for the ministry he will soon undertake. The baptism that Jesus under goes at the hands of John is part of the ritual leading up to the full disclosure of who this Jesus really is. Jesus is the Son of God

Saint Gregory of Nyssa ~c. 335-395~



The son of two saints, Basil and Emmilia, young Gregory was raised by his older brother, Saint Basil the Great, and his sister, Macrina, in modern-day Turkey. Gregory's success in his studies suggested great things were ahead for him. After becoming a professor of rhetoric, he was persuaded to devote his learning and efforts to the Church. Gregory, mar-

ried, went on to study for the priesthood and become ordained (at a time when celibacy was not a matter of law for priests). He was elected Bishop of Nyssa in 372, a period of great tension over the Arian heresy, which denied the divinity of Christ. It was after the death of his beloved brother Basil, that Gregory really came into his own. He wrote with great effectiveness against Arianism gaining a reputation as a defender of orthodoxy. He was sent on missions to counter other heresies and held a position of prominence at the Council of Constantinople. His fine reputation stayed with him for the remainder of his life. Saint Gregory of Nyssa is seen not simply as a pillar of orthodoxy but as one of the great contributors to the mystical tradition in Christian spirituality and to monasticism itself. His feast day is observed on January 10th.

- What signs will I rejoice in?


