

Pastoral Reflections

Scripture Reflection (2nd Sun in Ord. Year C)

of the chosen people now reaches a high point when he addresses Jerusalem as the bride of God. The story of the wedding feast at Cana is the first of seven signs around which half of John's Gospel is structured (Chapters 1 through 12 are referred to as "The Book of Signs"). A sign is a miraculous activity of Jesus that discloses his identity as Messiah and Son of God. Doing these signs is the special "work" that Jesus has been given by his Father. Some who witness these signs will believe in Jesus, but others will not.

In this reading the prophet's devotion to the salvation

One's response to Jesus' signs is always a matter of faith, not an issue of proof.

They have no wine. The setting for this sign is a wedding feast in the town of Cana. We are given few details aside from the fact that Jesus, his mother, and his disciples are there. A major problem has emerged: They have run out of wine. This would be considered shameful and embarrassing for the host. The mother of Jesus brings this issue to his attention. While Jesus seems to distance himself from the problem by declaring his hour has not yet come, his mother seems confident he will do something. Hour in John's Gospel

refers to Jesus' death and glorification.

Six stone water jars. Jesus turns his attention to six stone water jars used for Jewish purification rites. They are made from stone because stone is not susceptible to ritual impurity. Altogether, these jars would hold 20 to 30 gallons. That is an abundance of liquid, be it water or wine. Jesus simply instructs the servers to fill all these jars to the brim. We are given no details as to how this water all of a sudden became wine. All we know is that there is now wine enough for several wedding feasts.

The beginning of his signs. When the head waiter tastes this new wine, he is astounded by its quality. He also has no idea where it has come from. New wine has been created in the old vessels of Jewish purification rites. These old forms have been given new content. Something new here has been created. This new wine symbolizes the promise of God's abundance of salvation. It is easy to see how this new wine quickly took on eucharistic overtones for the early Christians. This sign revealed Jesus' glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

Saint Sebastian ~c. 256-January 20, 287~



Almost nothing is historically certain about Sebastian except that he was a Roman martyr, was venerated in Milan in the time of Saint Ambrose and was buried on the Appian Way, probably near the present Basilica of St. Sebastian. Devotion to him spread rapidly, and he is mentioned in several martyrologies as early

as 350. The legend of Saint Sebastian is important in art, and there is a vast iconography. Scholars now agree that a pious fable has Sebastian entering the Roman army because only there could he assist the martyrs without arousing suspicion. Finally he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. His body was pierced with arrows, and he was left for dead. But he was found still alive by those who came to bury him. He recovered, but refused to flee. One day he took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He accosted the emperor, denouncing him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. He was buried on the Appian Way, close to the catacombs that bear his name. His feast day is observed on January 20th.



Mass Intentions

As we enter into a new year (WELCOME 2022) the information regarding the practice of "Mass Offerings" is worth repeating

It doesn't cost anything...but if you're able to give, an offering is appreciated. There is no price tag on the Mass, however, it is customary to give an offering when requesting a Mass for an intention. That said, money should never be the reason for deciding against this beautiful tradition. Simply make your request known. It doesn't have to be a large sum. The Seraphic Mass Association, for example, suggests a donation of just ten dollars per Mass.

A Mass can be offered for a person who is still living. In other words, if you know someone who could benefit from the spiritual graces that come with having a Mass said on their behalf, there is no need to delay in doing so.

You can have a Mass said in Thanksgiving or for a celebration Masses can be said for birthdays, anniversaries, in celebration of the reception of the sacraments, or for prayers that have been answered!

Sacred Heart is **very** low on Mass requests as the bulk of the Masses are said here so please keep this practice in mind as the year progresses . **AND** if any St Michael folks are ok with Mass being said at Sacred Heart during the week so as to have it said more quickly simply call the office to let us know. Thanks everyone!

Soon our diocese will take up the Collection for the Church in Latin America. This national collection supports many pastoral projects that benefit the faithful in Latin America and the Caribbean.

Brazil's Associacao do Sementes do Verbo (Seeds of the Word Community) is a young and growing congregation with a unique vision of forming missionary communities of disciples in all states of life—consecrated men and women, clergy, lay missionaries, and married couples and families, all living together in community. Founded in 2004, Sementes do Verbo has 20 communities throughout Brazil, as well as in Portugal, Belgium, Canada, Comoros, and Mozambique. A central aspect of the group's spirituality is a nine-month formation period called a "sabbatical year," during which participants live in a mission house with the community and study Scripture; take courses in the theology of the body and human sexuality, with an emphasis on prevention of abuse; and participate in spiritual exercises and parish mission weeks.

Supported by a grant from the Subcommittee on the Church in Latin America, 100 participants from 25 dioceses in 11 Brazilian states had the opportunity to become formed as more effective missionary disciples in 2021. When you support the Collection for the Church in Latin America, your material gift makes it possible for disciples to use their gifts and abilities as evangelizers, regardless of their states in life or economic backgrounds.
