

St Michael's Parish Tithing Goal

The Parish Tithing amount for December collections was calculated at \$507.00 or 10% of the monthly collection which was \$5070.00 and a check has been sent to the diocese. To date the PCT payments have totaled \$2548.00.00.

Pastoral Reflections

Scripture Reflection (6th, Sun in Ord. Year C) Jeremiah spoke words of life for king and people. But sadly, his message was consistently rejected. So, in this reading the prophet confronts his detractors with vivid images that may motivate them to listen. Today's Gospel begins Luke's "Sermon on the Plain" (6:17–49), similar to Matthew's "Sermon on the Mount." Unlike Matthew's setting for his sermon on a mountain, Luke prefers to show Jesus close to the crowds he addresses. Thus, the disciples and a large number of people representing Jews and gentiles are located on level ground with Jesus.

Blessings. Luke begins his account with a series of four beatitudes. These are wisdom forms that express a combination of happiness, being fortunate, and being blessed. The surprising element in each beatitude, however, highlights some kind of condition of diminishment: poverty, hunger, weeping, hate, exclusion, and denunciation. The reason why those experiencing such diminishment are blessed is that the diminishment will ultimately be transformed into blessing. Future blessings will far outweigh current hardships. A day is coming when God will reverse the fortunes of those believers who have remained faithful

during current distress. The subject matter of this diminishment is real poverty, hunger, and harsh social conditions. But there is more to it than that. There is also the spiritual dimension, the foundation out of which hope for the future can be experienced.

Woes. The "woe oracle" is found in much of the prophetic literature of the Old Testament. Originally, it was funeral language expressing sadness and grief for a loved one who died. In the Old Testament prophets, such an oracle proclaims negative judgment against those who have failed to keep the covenant with God in terms of justice as well as care for the poor and oppressed. For Luke, the woes are addressed to the rich, to those whose bellies are full, and to those who laugh at the current social situation. Also included are those who received accolades from others. False prophets engaged in this kind of practice.

In harmony or out of harmony. These blessings and woes are aimed at those people who live their lives either in harmony or out of harmony with the restored rule of God. They are meant to address real issues that Luke's community is facing. Their purpose is to proclaim that God does indeed reward the faith. Saints Cyril and Methodius ~Feast Day: Feb 14~



Their father was an officer in a part of Greece inhabited by many Slavs; these two Greek brothers became missionaries, teachers, and patrons of the Slavic peoples. Cyril refused the governorship of a district and withdrew to a monastery where his brother Methodius had become a monk after some. When the Duke of Moravia asked the


Eastern Emperor Michael for political independence from German rule and ecclesiastical autonomy., Cyril and Methodius undertook the missionary task. Cyril's first work was to invent an alphabet. His followers probably formed the Cyrillic alphabet. Together they translated the Gospels, the psalter, Paul's letters and the liturgical books into Slavonic, and composed a Slavonic liturgy. That and their free use of the vernacular in preaching led to opposition from the German clergy. The bishop refused to consecrate Slavic bishops and priests, and Cyril was forced to appeal to Rome. There, he and Methodius had the joy of seeing their new liturgy approved by Pope Adrian II. Cyril, long an invalid, died in Rome 50 days after taking the monastic habit. Methodius continued mission work for 16 more years. He was papal legate for all the Slavic peoples, consecrated a bishop and then given an ancient see. The Bavarian bishops retaliated with a violent storm of accusation against Methodius. Emperor Louis the German exiled Methodius for three years. Pope John VIII secured his release. But the Frankish clergy, still smarting, continued their accusations; Methodius had to go to Rome to defend himself against charges of heresy and uphold his use of the Slavonic liturgy. He was again vindicated. Legend has it that in a feverish period of activity, Methodius translated the whole Bible into Slavonic in eight months. He died on Tuesday of Holy Week, surrounded by his disciples, in his cathedral church.


